Dear Parent / Carer and Young Person,

### Annual seasonal flu vaccination is now due

All children from reception to year 11 are being offered a free flu vaccination in school, as part of the national vaccination programme. Flu can be an unpleasant illness and make some people seriously ill. The flu vaccination is **safe and effective**. It helps to protect against seasonal flu and serious related complications, such as bronchitis, ear infections and pneumonia. It will also help to prevent the spread of flu and protect others who are vulnerable. There are two different types of vaccine available:

#### Nasal spray flu vaccine

**This vaccine offers the best protection against flu.** It is given as a spray, squirted up each nostril. It's quick and painless.

For some children the nasal spray is not suitable for medical reasons. Our team will review the medical information submitted before offering the flu vaccine injection.

The nasal vaccine contains traces of a highly processed form of porcine gelatine.

#### Flu vaccine injection

The injection is given into the muscle in the upper arm, which may cause soreness.

This vaccine is offered as an alternative if the nasal spray is not suitable due to medical reasons. This vaccine does **not** contain porcine gelatine.

## Important information: Young people can consent for the vaccine.

If we do not receive a parental or carer consent decision for the vaccination, using the below process, we may allow the young person to self-consent to the vaccination on the day. We will only offer this opportunity to young people in year 8 and above, who have read the appropriate vaccination information and who are assessed by a health professional as having enough understanding to fully appreciate what's involved. Only those who are clearly comfortable in receiving the immunisation will have it.

If parents or carers have responded and refused consent, the decision cannot be overruled by a young person, and we will not vaccinate. More information can be found at:

## How to give consent for your child to get the flu vaccination

- Make a note of the code for your school. For **Crown Hills Community College** the school code is **LE120277** and visit [www.leicsandrutlandimms.co.uk](http://www.leicsandrutlandimms.co.uk) or scan the QR code using your smartphone camera to go straight to the website.
- Select **Seasonal Flu**, enter the school code and fill out the form. On the consent declaration page you can consent for the nasal flu vaccine **or** the injectable flu vaccine.
- You will receive a confirmation email when the form is submitted.

Your school will let you know when the flu vaccination session will take place. **The consent system will close one working day before the vaccination session.** You will not be able to submit a consent form on the day.

## Frequently asked questions about the flu vaccine

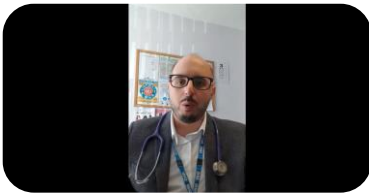
Frequently asked questions	
My child has a health condition and normally has the vaccine from the GP.	They are also able to have the vaccination at school.
What are the side effects?	Children may develop a runny or blocked nose, headache, general tiredness and some loss of appetite. These symptoms are much milder than developing flu or complications associated with flu. Serious side-effects are uncommon.
Why is there a new flu injection every year?	Flu viruses change every year, so flu vaccines are updated to protect against the latest strains.

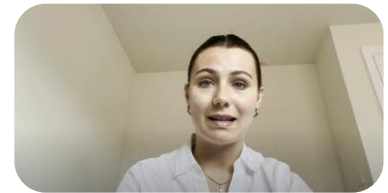

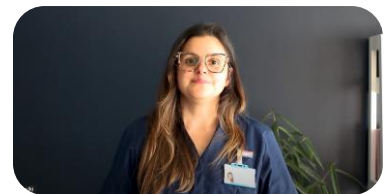
