



They were particularly impressed with all our work surrounding fencing and couldn't believe this was something we offered as a state school. It is fantastic to get this recognition after the hard work over the past few years to cement our fencing programme.

Our students were fantastic at passing their fencing knowledge on to others. They were commended by staff who attended for their leadership skills. The leaders also got to help at the annual East Leicester Sportshall athletics competition. Their precision and professionalism helped the event to run smoothly.
